Winter 2013

Gerald, CLRSS volunteers, and LCS students began work on the site by the museum that had been cleared by the town's work crew.





In the spring of **2014 a CLRSS** work party prepared the garden for Lake Days.





Fall 2015

CLRSS volunteers began a regular maintenance program by adding soil and removing invasive species.






The plants were left to mature for more than a year, with limited maintenance.
